Aysgarth Falls



Aysgarth Falls, an impressive triple flight of waterfalls, were used for Robin Hood's watery clash with Little John in Kevin Costner's film *Robin Hood: Prince of Thieves*.



Semer Water



Semer Water, at half a mile long, is North Yorkshire's largest natural lake. It was formed as the ice melted during the end of the last Ice Age.

Hardraw Force is one of the longest single-drop waterfalls in England – the water rushes down about 30 metres!

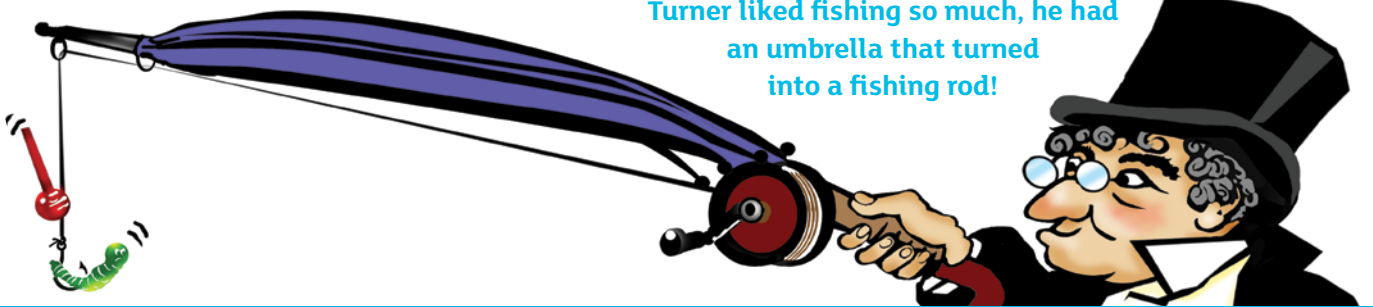
